

Obtaining a Firearms Licence

Please note: These are general steps only. Additional steps will apply to some licence types. Please refer to the

Ensure you are eligible to apply:

refer to **Qld Police Service (QPS)** for eligibility criteria.

Select an appropriate licence and genuine reason.

You can join an approved club and nominate this as your genuine reason to hold a Licence on your application form. Refer to QPS for accepted genuine reasons.

Complete the VET Approved Firearms Licence Safety Training Course with a registered instructor.

The Queensland Rifle Association runs VET Approved Category A & B Safety Training Courses regularly on Sundays. Upon successful completion you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment which is valid for 12 months. **Cost: \$80**

Complete & lodge Weapons Licence Application Forms.

Download all forms required for licence application from www.police.qld.gov.au/programs/weaponsLicensing/ or obtain forms from your local Queensland Police Service (QPS) station. Lodge your completed forms with your Statement of Attainment, proof of club membership, proof of identity and other required supporting documentation at your local police station and pay the prescribed fees. **Cost: as per QPS scale of fees**

Purchasing a Firearm

Complete a QPS *Permit to Acquire* form and process through QPS and a licensed Firearms Dealer. **Cost: as per QPS scale of fees**

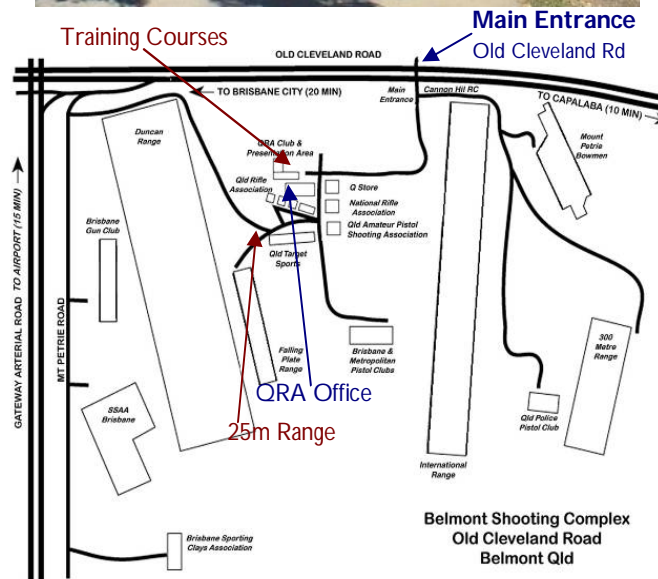

The Queensland Rifle Association

The Queensland Rifle Association (QRA) was first formed in 1861 and reformed in 1877 to provide marksmanship training to citizens in the interest of the defence of the colony. Many clubs can trace their origins back to early colonial times so we can truly claim to be the oldest organised sport in Australia.

The QRA is affiliated with the National Rifle Association of Australia (NRAA). Membership and active participation in a rifle club offers firearms owners a safe and convenient venue for their use and a **genuine reason to hold a licence.**

Eligibility

Shooting is open to men and women and Queensland law designates that a person using a rifle must be a minimum of 11 years of age. Adults 18 years and over must meet certain criteria to be eligible for a Queensland Licence.

Firearms Licence Safety Training Courses

The QRA regularly runs VET Approved Safety Training Courses which eligible persons must complete before applying for a Queensland Firearms Licence.

The Queensland Shooting Club

The Queensland Shooting Club (QSC) is designed for members who are not actively competing or regularly shooting but still wish to maintain membership of an approved rifle club. QSC members are not eligible for NRAA Competitions. Queensland Shooting Club insurance cover only applies when shooting on approved QRA ranges.
